POSITION

The Board will support the work of Spano Foundation and provide mission-based leadership, strategic governance, fundraising and policy making. While day-to-day operations are led by the Executive Director, the Board-ED relationship is a partnership, and the appropriate involvement of the Board is both critical and expected.

RESPONSIBILITIES

- Serving as a trusted advisor to the executive director as the develops and implements policy and strategic governance with assist of the board.
- Representing the Spano Foundation to stakeholders; acting as an ambassador for the organization
- Reviewing outcomes and metrics created by the Spano Foundation for evaluating its impact, and regularly
 measuring its performance and effectiveness using those metrics; reviewing agenda and supporting
 materials prior to board and committee meetings
- Ensuring the commitment to a diverse board and staff that reflects the communities Think Kindness serves
- Approving annual budget, audit reports, and material business decisions; being informed of, and meeting all, legal and fiduciary responsibilities
- Contributing to an annual performance evaluation of the Executive Director.
- Assisting the board in identifying and recruiting other Board Members
- Serving on committees or task forces and taking on special assignments
- Assists with and participates in all fundraising activities, projects and special events as directed and approved by the Board

BOARD TERMS AND PARTICIPATION

Spano Foundation Board Members will serve a three-year term to be eligible for re-appointment with majority board vote. Board meetings will be held 1-2 a year scheduled by the Board and committee meetings will be held in coordination with full board meetings.



QUALIFICATIONS

Selected Board Members will have achieved leadership stature in business, government, philanthropy, or the nonprofit sector. Ideal candidates will have the following qualifications:

- Extensive professional experience with significant executive leadership accomplishments in business, government, philanthropy, or the nonprofit sector
- A preference for individuals who have already served for 2 years on a non-profit board or have worked at an executive level with non-profit agencies.
- A commitment to and understanding of Spano Foundation beneficiaries, preferably based on experience.
- Savvy diplomatic skills and a natural affinity for cultivating relationships and persuading, convening, facilitating, and building consensus among diverse individuals
- Personal qualities of integrity, credibility, and a passion for improving the lives of the community beneficiaries.

Service on the Anthony V Spano Foundation is without pay, except for administrative support, travel, and accommodation costs in relation as approved by the Board of Trustees.
